My school is located in a lower-income area of Coruña. In my first few months, I realized that many of the students were having difficulties in their learning. Moreover, my school has a considerable student population of Romani and Dominican immigrants who are falling behind the rest of the students at school. 1. This school offers certificates (ciclos) in health (e.g. nursing), sociocultural services, and graphic arts. They have not had an English assistant in recent years and welcomed any amount of time I could share, depending on my weekly schedule. 2. "I had visions for splitting the choir into different parts and musicians, but it was hard to do that with limited resources, time, and commitment. 5b. Fundacion Amaranta is a national organization with a base in Ourense run by a group of religious sisters. It is a women's shelter for anyone coming from situations of domestic violence, trafficking, prostitution, etc. Women and their children can live in the center or on their own and can access health, housing, and other social services. I taught an English course at the center since there were a lot of women interested in starting/improving their English.	Someone with strong Spanish language skills would be best since no one that works there speaks much English.	There are a lot of opportunities to lead courses there- a future Fulbright who wanted to continue with English, yoga, crafts, homework help for kids, etc would absolutely be welcome! If you call, keep in mind that whoever answers the phone will most likely not answer with the name of the organization (I think it is a confidentiality thing in case anyone redials). Just tell them why you are calling and you will eventually get in touch with the right person!
Ourense	Cruz Roja	Natividad (program for elderly)	Tlf: 988 222 484; Natividad (ext. 57300)	I volunteered with the Red Cross in Ourense in their program for elderly people. I spent 2.5 hours a week visiting a woman who was bedbound with cancer. I would go to her home and just chat with her and keep her company. Since I am a nurse, I would try to help her with understanding her medications and the possible side effects they can have and ways to relieve those issues. However, anyone who is not a nurse could easily do this! She just wanted someone to talk to and her husband wanted the opportunity to leave the house without leaving her alone.	I would imagine a high level of fluency in Spanish is required, as it is very unlikely that the other Cruz Roja volunteers or the population that they serve speak any English. A medical background, however, is not required.	It was such a wonderful and rewarding experience and I miss her dearly! In order to be a volunteer with the Cruz Roja in Ourense, it is necessary to attend a 1.5 hour volunteer training session that is held once a month. Then, the volunteer meets with the volunteer coordinator to discuss where his/her skills and interests best fit in with the volunteer options - there are many opportunities to volunteer that relate to helping with unemployment, youth development, vulnerable populations, etc.
